Kindergarten Diagnostics

Now that we have six weeks of school under our belts, it's time to learn more about our kindergarten friends through academic diagnostics this coming week. Kindergarteners will take the i-Ready Diagnostics in Reading and Math along with some Aimsweb screenings and testing in the area of reading. Kindergarteners will also be assessed through our district's reading program with an assessment called the IRLA. From this assessment, we will determine each students' reading level and where to focus to help each learn to read as quickly and efficiently as possible. 

-Christopher Columbus Day-Wisconsin public school observance day required by statute. The first expedition led by Christopher Columbus sighted land somewhere in the Bahamas on October 12, 1492. Columbus' voyages are recognized as the start of sustained contact between peoples in the eastern and western hemispheres. The process of colonization that he began brought new forms of wealth to Europe, expanded the market for African slaves, and led to loss of land and lifeways for the indigenous peoples of the Americas. The federal holiday, Discoverers' Day, is celebrated the second Monday in October.

Art:

This month, students will be exploring the artistic concepts of color and texture through hands-on projects. Grades K–4 will each design and create their own unique fall leaf, with each grade level experimenting in different artistic media. Throughout this unit, we will connect our work to the Autumn season, using nature's changes as inspiration to study warm and cool color families. Students will also practice techniques for building layered textures, helping them see how artists can create depth and visual interest in their work.
