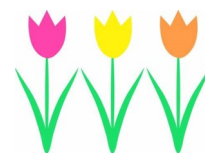
Our Learning Showcase was a huge success. We hope you enjoyed the displays as well as our

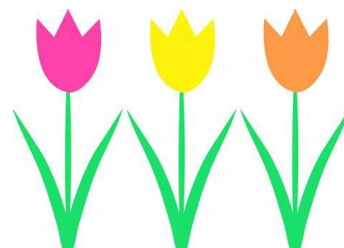
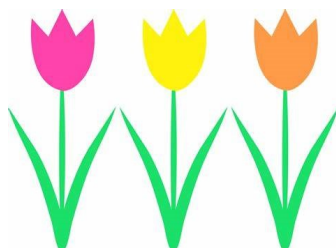
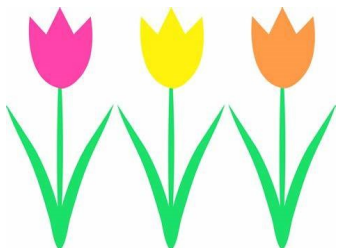
