Winter Weather and Unforeseen School Closures

Should the need to close on-campus instruction during the 2024-2025 academic year occur due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances, the District will utilize an E-Learning/At-Home Learning framework to meet daily learning expectations. Google Classroom will be utilized as the primary

learning platform for students in grades 5 through 12. Pre-Kindergarten through grade 4 students will receive advanced At-Home Learning expectations from classroom teachers to fulfill during a day of At-Home Learning.



If the District cancels the traditional at-school learning day, typically, notification will be made by 5:30 a.m. via Skylert messaging, the District website, Facebook and local TV and radio stations. Students will be encouraged to utilize the day to address E-Learning/At-Home Learning expectations. Please note that extracurricular activities will also be canceled on days that at-school learning is closed. The District Administrator or the designee can make special arrangements if necessary.

Key Factors Considered in Weather Closure or Delay Decisions

- Alerts regarding road conditions and weather from various sources, including weather websites, local TV stations, the County Patrol, the New London Police Department, the district transportation department, communication with neighboring school districts, and firsthand assessments of road conditions.

**Related Conditions That May Lead to Cancellations or Delays **

- Snow, ice, fog, drifting, and severe cold, both current and forecasted.

- Building or system failures.

Bulldogs of Character at the Winter Wonderland Parade



Academic Career Planning for 2025



students in a variety of opportunities during their high school career. Our goal for the academic and career planning process is to make sure all students and families are informed consumers of the educational options New London High School has to offer. An overview of the scheduling process, graduation requirements, and career and college readiness opportunities will be discussed.

The High School counselors will provide a presentation that will cover scheduling, pathways, academic planning, and a variety of other helpful information. Each student will receive a folder with high school information and scheduling resources. The High School counselors will share the slideshow with families that were not able to attend.

Following Future Freshmen/ACP night, the counselors will present the same information to all 8th grade students at the Middle School and Emanuel and help them start scheduling courses. The High School counselors will return to the Middle School and Emanuel in mid January and meet with each student individually to discuss and check their course selections. Parents and students will be provided the scheduling dates and deadlines ahead of time via email.
