## **Budget Topic**

The 2025-27 biennium budget process is under way and there is a topic that is important to understand the impact it has for New London.



This is the appropriation for the Special Education and School-Age Parents Aid program. All Wisconsin school districts are eligible for this categorical aid based upon eligible expenditures for students who qualify for special education programming. The categorical aid amount is received throughout the fiscal year based upon prior year costs.

During the 2023-25 biennium there was significant discussion about moving this reimbursement percentage up to at least 33% of eligible costs. The budget summary published by the State of Wisconsin estimated the amount to be 33.3% reimbursement of eligible costs in 2023-24 and 2024-25. This was an important development because that categorical aid did not increase much over several bienniums.

The local challenge is that this categorical aid is <u>not sufficient</u> but <u>sum certain</u>. This means that the appropriation of money is a set number in the state budget instead of a sum sufficient to get to 33% of eligible costs. This is a key variable in all school district budgets.

This year New London was expecting \$1,816,789 in categorical aid. In the latest update we received the actual reimbursement is expected to be around 29.6% of eligible costs. This will be over \$70,000 in revenue the district will not receive because the appropriation was less than the intended goals of the 2023-25 biennium budget. This will require a larger transfer from Fund 10 to 27 to cover the costs. Each year the district transfers just under \$4,000,000 from fund 10 to 27.

School districts are faced with many challenges in their budget. Closing achievement gaps and student growth are measures on the school report cards. These two categories cover all students in school

districts but I wonder why more funding is not appropriated for special education categorical aids. Districts are expected to close achievement gaps and maximize student achievement with fewer resources to do so or make cuts in other areas of the budget to meet funding requirements.

of boots and coats for our students. The School District of New London would like to thank Gloria for her continued support of the district for the past several years.




#### **February 7, 2025**
