Property Tax Bills

Property tax bills were mailed in December and included here are a few reminders if you receive questions:

- The levy approved by the Board was 2.3% lower than 2023.
- The mill rate (5.33) approved by the Board was 10.4% lower than 2023.
- Property valuation increased by 9.1%.
- Depending on the municipality the property tax owner lives in, the net school property tax impact could vary significantly.
- Tax bills should be received for items like the school levy credits, valuation changes and other taxing jurisdictions to analyze impacts

 Overall, most property tax payers will see a reduction to the school portion of property taxes.

A key factor to share when discussing the tax bills is that New London still is at the floor (\$11,325) for the revenue limit per student and also is well below the state average (7.09) for mill rate.

Five Additional AED Devices will be arriving

In addition to the recent donation from the Shamrock Club of New London for the purchase of an AED (automated external defibrillator) device, the district has received funding from two additional sources for the purchase of five more AED devices. Three will be provided from a 75% match from Gold Cross Ambulance. The other two devices will be coming forward from an anticipated donation from the Manawa Masons. One of these devices is recommended to be placed at the bowling alley, to support our middle school and high school bowling teams.

ACCESS Testing Has Concluded



Federal and state laws require that students identified as English Learners (ELs) be assessed annually to determine their

level of English language proficiency (ELP) and ensure that they are progressing in achieving full English proficiency. This includes students who receive special education services. The ACCESS assessment window this year was from December 2, 2024, thru January 31, 2025. The School District of New London has over 100 students taking the ACCESS assessment. At this time, our district is 100% complete with testing. Our bilingual teachers and tutors complete this testing with our students, and when the test results (scores) arrive, they will be shared with families.

Dynamic Learning Maps Testing Window

Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) assessments are for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities for whom general state assessments are not appropriate, even with accommodations. DLM assessments offer these students a way to show what they know and can do in English Language Arts, mathematics, and science. This year the test window will be March 17-April 25, 2025.

4K Enrollment/Registration
