Practice ACT Exam- Grades 9-11

On Wednesday, October 18th, all 9th, 10th, and 11th-grade students will complete a practice ACT exam. The ACT is a valuable and accurate measure of college and career readiness. The test will help students prepare for the state-mandated ACT test that is given to Juniors in the Spring of each year. The practice ACT also provides comprehensive data that assists teachers in developing classroom instruction. The practice ACT will gather and analyze data and tell us which college and career readiness skills your student has now and which skills need to be learned or improved. Students and staff will have access to their ACT practice results within a week of taking the exam. Each student will receive an individualized report with their results and study plan. This will be a full day of school for students in grades 9-11.

ACT Bootcamp- Grade 11

On Monday, February 19th all 11th-grade students will participate in an ACT Bootcamp from 8:00-12:00. NLHS has partnered with the [Academic Tutoring Center](#) in order to provide students with proven strategies, tips, and tricks to improve performance on the ACT. An individual approach is implemented based on the student's practice ACT results. For many of our students, their ACT score can have a significant impact on post-secondary plans and scholarship opportunities. District transportation will not be available, so please arrange transportation.

ACT Prep Sessions at NLHS-Grades 9-11

NLHS will be offering multiple ACT prep sessions each week during the Intervention and Enrichment (I/E) block. The sessions are available for students in grades 9-11. The prep sessions will focus on strategies, tips, and tricks proven to improve student performance. Students interested should sign up in the I/E scheduler.
