STEP Program

During the 2024 -2025 academic year, the District's Senior Tax Exchange Program (STEP) will again be an active initiative to support instructional and DIstrict programming. The program allows senior citizens, 62 years of age and older, whose primary residences are in the School District of New London and who pay property taxes on these residences, to work in the District in exchange for property tax credit. Pay is \$6.50 per hour. Two (but not more than two) eligible residents of the same property may share work to meet the \$429 maximum amount for each primary residence, but combined pay cannot

exceed \$429. This \$429 amounts to a maximum of 66 work hours per household.

STEP programming provides individuals the opportunity to contribute within the District by providing students and staff support which promote:

- Increased one-on-one learning experiences
- Increased small group learning experiences
- Positive social and emotional interactions
- Cross-generational experience
- Improved support from retired members of the community
- Opportunity to demonstrate the "great things" schools are doing
- Opportunity to increase community awareness of the changes in our schools
- More help in and out of classrooms
