EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS

The School District of New London offers a variety of educational options in an effort to ensure "Success for All Students."

The District's primary educational pathway and instructional program for students involves a progression from 4-year-old-kindergarten through Grade 12 leading to a high school diploma. Schools in our district include Lincoln Elementary School (Grades 4K-4), Parkview Elementary School (Grades 4K-4), Readfield Elementary School (Grades 4K-4), Sugar Bush Elementary School (Grades 4K-4), New London Intermediate/Middle School (Grades 6-8), New London High School (Grades 9-12), and Catalyst Academy (Grades 7-12).

Education programs offered to eligible students who are enrolled in and attending the District's schools include:

- Early Childhood (for children who qualify for these special education services and who are at least 3 years of age but not yet school age)
- Special Education programming for children with disabilities (age 3-21)
- Section 504
- English Learner (EL) education
- Bilingual/Bicultural education
- Title I Services
- Gifted and Talented education
- Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs
- Summer school education
- Individualized program and curriculum modifications, including at-risk and alternative education programming

In addition to the traditional, high quality education offered within our classrooms, the School District of New London seeks to provide educational options to meet the diverse needs and interests of its students. Options include:

- Transcribed, Dual Credit and Advanced Standing
- Career Pathway courses including industry-standard certifications
- Distance Learning, Virtual and Blend-Ed courses
- Youth Apprenticeships as advised by WI DWD
- GED Option #2 Program
- The Part-Time Open Enrollment Program, as authorized under section 118.52 of the state statutes.
- The Early College Credit Program, as authorized under section 118.55 of the state statutes.
- The Technical College Course Program, as authorized under section 38.12(14) of the state statutes.

- Other: open enrollment; private schools within 5 mile radius, part-time enrollment for homeschooled students

The School District of New London, New London High School, New London Intermediate/Middle School, Lincoln Elementary, and Sugar Bush Elementary are noted as "Exceeds Expectations." Parkview Elementary and Readfield Elementary "Significantly Exceeds Expectations."

Next Generation Academy, Catalyst, and Private School Emanuel Lutheran have a limited number of students and therefore use an alternative system for accountability.
